## MEMBER SPOT



Since its founding in 1990, the mission of the Brownville Concert Series has been twofold: (1) to bring nationally and internationally renowned musical performers to a rural, underserved area of Nebraska and (2) conduct student or community outreach evens (required as part of every performer's contract) which may include visits to schools, churches, nursing homes, etc. and free master classes or music workshops.

As to the first part of their mission, it is well know that they have been successful in attracting highly notable artists and forging a Brownville/Broadway connection. They received the 2010 Governor's Arts Award for Organization. The recent PBS Centennial Celebration of Leonard Bernstein at Tanglewood featured 3 performers who had played Brownville. Tony Yazbeck (Tony Nominee for On the Town) in 2017, NY Met Mezzo Soprano Jennifer Johnson in 2010 and NY Met Soprano Nadiene Sierra in 2008. There are many more examples if you look at their past performers roster online.

More importantly and probably lesser known is the extent of their student and community outreach. Every performer is required to conduct an outreach activity including visits to schools or nursing homes (gifting 20 free tickets with each visit), giving free master classes (including free tickets) or workshops. Although they are a mostly volunteer non-profit, the few persons paid are the Technical Crew, primarily area high school and college students who assist backstage and with sound and lighting and all things relating to production.

One rural student success story would be David Von Behrends of Falls City who attended our master classes for several years and stayed in correspondence with the classical artists who also helped him apply to music schools including Julliard. He was accepted by Julliard and the Cleveland School of Music plus five other music schools but decided on the Cleveland School of Music. He continued his graduate studies at the Stanford School of Music and appeared on NPR's From the Top with Christopher O'Reiley (a past Brownville performer).

Another is Nora Baker of Shubert who had worked for several years as a Stage Tech, attending our master classes and playing with the Omaha Youth Symphony, she won a full scholarship to the University of Iowa School of Music.

In February of 2017, the Concert Series showcased its talented Tech Crew in a free concert entitled "Tech Crew & Friends" to a packed audience. This was orchestrated by their Lead Tech at the time, Sheila Murphy of Auburn High School.

Other activities include school visits and community outreaches such as the following: Jazz Class taught at Rockport High School, Performances at Nebraska City Middle School, Auburn Middle and High School, the Good Samaritan Society in Auburn and many more, while also giving away free tickets.

In June 2019, the Concert Series donated the Hall and Steinway piano for Auburn Music Student and BCS Stage Tech Trace Moody to hold is Senior Music Recital enjoyed by approximately 80 students and family members.

There continues to be more and more outreach activities and events as the Brownville Concert Series continues to pursue its mission to bring professional live performance to a rural, underserved The program is varied and area of Nebraska. instrumental, includes classical Cabaret performances based on the American Songbook, Jazz, Rock and Roll, Bluegrass, Voice Recitals, Opera and a specially commissioned Christmas "The People you are hearing are the top Gala. artists available in new York and other large cities the music you are hearing in Brownville is as good as it gets".

#### SENCA Weatherization - Energy Saving Solutions

To create more awareness of the Weatherization Assistance Program, and the energy saving benefits the program provides to qualifying households, October 30th is recognized each year as National Weatherization Day. SENCA has been weatherizing homes of eligible, low-income households since 1975.

With above normal temperatures throughout much of October most of us are not ready, or even thinking about, freezing temps and higher utility costs that will soon be a reality. While this is an inconvenience for many households, the colder winter months are more challenging for low-income households who fear they won't be able to pay the higher utility costs.

Nebraska Thankfully Southeast Community Action Partnership, (SENCA) provides a Weatherization program to qualifying residents throughout the seven county service area of: Cass, Johnson. Nemaha, Otoe, Pawnee. Richardson and Sarpy. Weatherization enables low-income families, whether they own or rent their home, to reduce energy costs by helping to make their homes more energy efficient.

Potential Weatherization services include: insulation to the attic, walls and/or floors; replacement of broken glass in windows: installation primary or adjustment of door weather-stripping. thresholds and/or door sweeps; in addition to an efficiency inspection on natural gas, propane and fuel oil furnaces, or boilers. Hot water heater repair and/or replacement is also available. After improvements are completed households generally experience an increase in comfort, reduced drafts, more even temperatures throughout the home

and a reduction in heating and cooling costs. A typical residence who has benefitted from Weatherization services may experiences an average of 18.7% reduction in heating costs. Additional savings can also be achieved in cooling costs. Energy conservation helps reduce Nebraska's dependence on imported energy in addition to being a major contribution to the self-sufficiency of lowincome households. A reduction in energy costs can help economically challenged households stretch their available income to better meet the family's basic needs. During the 2021 fiscal year, October 1st -September 30th, SENCA provided 29 adults, residing in 24 homes, with energy improvements and conservation training, thereby improving lives and strengthening southeast Nebraska communities.

To receive free weatherization services combined household incomes must fall below 200% of the federal poverty level, which is revised annually. In 2021 a family of four could earn up to \$53,000 and qualify for assistance. Households with persons receiving either ADC (Aid to Dependent Children) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are automatically eligible for weatherization services.




