Southeast Community College celebrated the move into its new Nebraska City Learning Center with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Tuesday, Aug. 24.

The College offers credit and non-credit classes. business and workforce development, leisure and personal interest classes, as well as adult education classes and English as a Second Language (ESL) at each of its Learning Centers. The Centers were established as part of the 2015-2019 Strategic Plan so that SCC could better serve its 15-county service area. The location of the Learning Centers is geographically distributed across the service area to maximize the number of individuals living within a 35 mile radius from the centers. Programming at each center is determined by industry and community needs.

"I am so thankful and appreciative that SCC has made this substantial investment and commitment for students of all ages in our area," said Cindy Meyer, Learning Center Coordinator. "I love seeing growth through education in people at all levels."

The building, which was purchased last spring from Nebraska City Public Schools, features 12,500 square feet includes office and testing spaces, classrooms, including a health simulation room, a construction lab and much more including more parking. The increased space will allow SCC to offer more dual-credit and Southeast Nebraska Career Academy Partnership classes for high school students.

"The facility offers additional space for both credit and non-credit classes as well as student services. The additional space will allow for new programming and more class offerings in support of the education/training needs for Nebraska City residents of all ages, as well as the surrounding communities," Meyer said.

SCC opened 6 Learning Centers since 2016 at York, Falls City, Hebron, Wahoo, Plattsmouth and Nebraska City.

Having the SCC Learning Center in Nebraska City is truly a great asset to our community and it is in great hands with Cindy Meyer as the Learning Center Coordinator.

"I am eager and excited to assist students with a variety of education-related questions and help improve their lives through knowledge and discovery," Meyer said. "I encourage folks to stop by to check out our new learning center!"

2021 Fire Hydrant Testing Dates In Auburn

All fire hydrants will be turned on and tested to make certain they are in good working condition for winter. Tests will be conducted on Tuesdays thru Thursdays, during the weeks beginning October 5-7, 12-14 and 19-21.

The Board of Public Works (BPW) will operate all 200 fire hydrants to make certain they are functional. High velocity flushing removes any sediment that may have settled in the water mains.

Customers may find temporary discoloration of the water during these periods. This is normal and the water remains safe to drink. Before washing clothes on these days, please check the water for clarity. If it is not clear, please run until clear and then wash clothes.

If testing was not performed, it could affect the community's fire insurance rates.

"We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and BPW appreciates everyone's cooperation," commented Ken Swanson, BPW Water/Wastewater Manager




